



## **NAMI CAR SHOW JUDGING**

### **“PEOPLE’S CHOICE” FORMAT OVERVIEW**

Cars are grouped into broad categories, and the car with the most votes in a category wins. Voters select which car in each category they like the best based on whatever criteria they choose. The “People’s Choice” format is a pure beauty contest.

All car owners are given a ballot in their registration packets. General spectators can also purchase one ballot for \$1.00 (one per spectator). Both registered owners and spectators with ballots then walk the field and vote for their favorite cars.

### **CAR CATEGORIES**

- 1- Best in Show
- 2- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place
- 3- 3<sup>rd</sup> place
- 4- Honorable Mention
- 5- Honorable Mention
- 6- Honorable Mention

### **REGISTERING**

When owners register at the Command Center they will fill out a car registration form annotating what category their cars will compete in. A matching windshield dash form will also be completed to aid the voters in identifying what categories the car is competing in.

Cars can compete in multiple categories. For example, a 1969 Plymouth Roadrunner could enter in the Classic American Muscle (<1979), Mopar, and Best in Show categories.

### **VOTING**

The ballots will indicate the categories:

- 1- Best in Show
- 2- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place
- 3- 3<sup>rd</sup> place
- 4- Honorable Mention
- 5- Honorable Mention
- 6- Honorable Mention

People simply vote for the car(s) they like the best according to whatever personal criteria they may fancy. A judging guide is included on each ballot to assist the voter with their assessment:

- Body (condition, damage, quality, and detail of vehicle)
- Interior (includes trunk, condition, quality, and detail)
- Engine compartment (condition, quality, detail, and cleanliness)
- Paint (condition, quality, and detail)
- Tires/Wheels/Hubcaps (cleanliness and detail)
- Overall "wow" factor

To aid the public, include definitions of what a "GM, Ford, and Mopar" is. For example – "Ford" includes Ford, Lincoln, and Mercury.

Voters will vote for a car by writing in that car's registration number next to the corresponding category on the ballot. A fully completed ballot would have one registration number next to each category.

It's possible to vote for one car in multiple categories. Example, a voter really likes the 1969 Plymouth Roadrunner, registration # 1234. Their ballot would look like this:

- 1- Best in Show
- 2- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place
- 3- 3<sup>rd</sup> place
- 4- Honorable Mention
- 5- Honorable Mention
- 6- Honorable Mention

**AND THE WINNER IS ...**

The car with the most votes in a category wins that category award. A small trophy will be awarded to each category winner.
